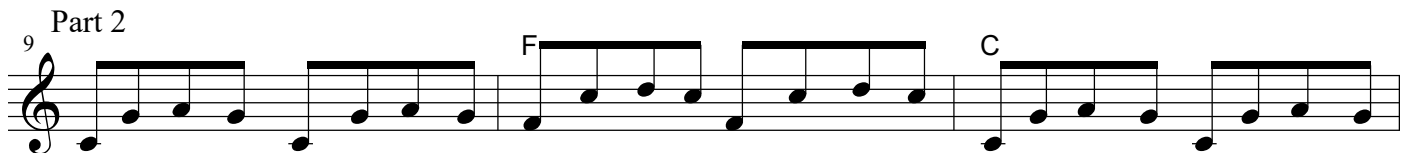

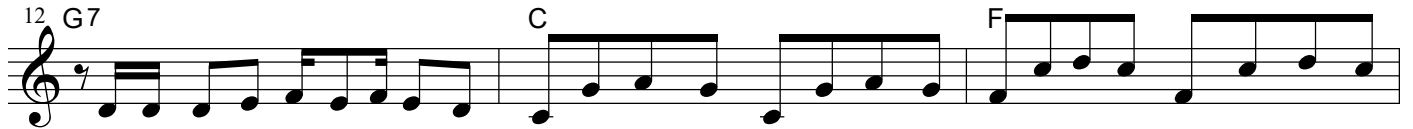
I'd like to hon-or you, what can I do for you? I'll watch and fig-ure it out. (op-por-tu-ni-te-hee!)



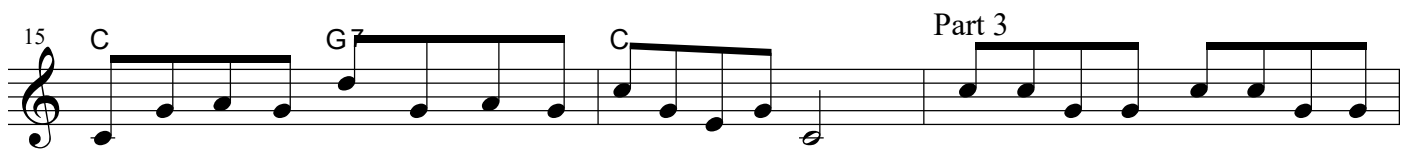
Where would you like to go? What would you like to eat? Please sit here on my best couch. (It makes me glad!)



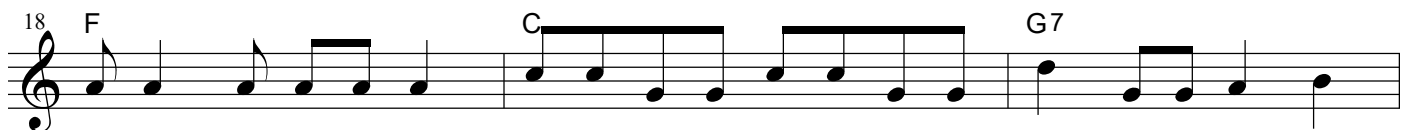
Af-ter you, Sir, please go first, Sir, Bro-ther, let's go see Grand-mo-ther; send a thank you note to Aunt Sue:
