

## **Additional Activities**

### **Lesson 1:**

Have the children write their names on a piece of paper and something about themselves, tell what they like, their favorite food, whether they have siblings and/or pets, etc. Choose someone to read their papers aloud while the class guesses who it is.

### **Lesson 2:**

Bring a detailed map of the World and the U.S. Find out where each child is from and mark it on the map.

### **Lesson 3:**

Make a list of things you could do to honor the people in your own family.

### **Lesson 4:**

Have the adult think of an animal, then describe it in detail. Have the children draw a picture of the animal based on the descriptions given by the teacher. See if they can guess the animal based on their drawings.

### **Lesson 5:**

Give each child a crayon and piece of paper. Draw a silhouette line drawing of the child sitting next to them. A silhouette is a side-profile, and a line drawing means your crayon cannot leave the paper, so the drawing is one continuous line.
